For MAW21 we examine the many ways the physical, social and technological structures of our world are formed, strengthened, and imagined. Our artists take their inspiration from the local heritage that surrounds us, including Boulby Mine (p.11), the iconic Dorman Long coke tower (p.13) and the transformational nature of the very material that lies beneath our feet (p.29).

We want as many people as possible to come and experience MAW. There are plenty of opportunities to get involved and the majority of our events are free, family friendly and as accessible as possible; this year we welcome the addition of a BSL interpreter for a curatorial walk through of the festival, as well as audio tours at The Auxiliary. 
The North East Open Call continues to grow from strength to strength. Partnering with Middlesbrough Institute of Modern Arts this years' exhibitions see 10 artists working across painting, drawing, installation, video and performance, with each artist's own unique take on the festival's theme of infrastructure. Particular to this show is the processes of each artist, and how these permeate the work on display.

SIDE GALLERY: THAT'S NOT IT EITHER

Russ Walker

Come one, come all and attend the reimagined play of artist Russ Walker dating back to 1986. A mix of sculpture and performance, this loosely copied piece brings forward a fresh outcome expanding on the experimental nature of the original script for viewers to experience live.

The original performance itself involved 3 actors on a flimsy stage, their state of mind reflected in the calamity of the stage whilst they discard their scripts and the director attempts to fix the stage.



BLUEPRINT

They share the work done so far. BLUEPRINT is a creative development programme for early career Tees Valley artists and creatives who want to hone and improve their skills creating work in film and video. Funded by Tees Valley Screen, this project is in collaboration with The Auxiliary Project Space and MIMA.

THE AUXILIARY FRONT FACADE: WE WALKED OUT OF THE WILDERNESS

A celebration of economic, cultural and civic achievements since then, this work is intended as reconciliation with the past. It celebrates the town's heritage, but crucially looks forward and suggests positive change and better times ahead.

The work is the beginning of something new; placing the trauma to one side, it is a beacon for our collective imagination, wellbeing and prosperity.

This neon light work is inspired by an iconic photograph taken by Evening Gazette photographer Peter Reimann 32 years ago, showing Margaret Thatcher walking into the wilderness on what was the site of the former Head Wrightson engineering works in Thornaby.



THE DORMAN LONG TOWER REIMAGINED A VIRTUAL REALITY EXPERIENCE

In the early hours of 19th September 2021, days after its last minute listing for Grade II heritage status was revoked by the Minister for Culture, this iconic building was demolished. However you felt about the Dorman Long Tower, one thing is certain; we couldn't discuss the theme of Infrastructure without discussing it. A Brutalist beast, it rose up in the 1950's, a glorious early example of this style of architecture. Over the decades, its practicality made redundant, it stood as a monument, a legacy of both good and bad; of things some people wished to remember, and that others did not.

The Dorman Long Tower is gone. But what it stood for - the heritage, the power, the ambition and strength - remains part of Teesside's spirit.

And long may that stand.

MAW21 commissions three very different exhibitions to take place in a virtual reality experience of the Dorman Long Towers' interior and invites you to come and explore. The tower has been transformed into a VR contemporary art gallery, created by artist lain Nicholls with assistance from Ste Bruce and Connor Clements.

Local artists Bobby Benjamin and David Watson present traditional painting with a post industrial town narrative, US artist Birch Cooper exhibits hyper realistic sculptures that can only be experienced in VR worlds, while new arts space WetDoveTail showcase their studioholders through digitally created 2D & 3D works.

This is our ode to the iconic Dorman Long.

WetDovetail is a collaborative virtual gallery project, comprised of two arts organisations, WET Productions and Dovetail Joints from the North East of England. Commencing September 2021 WetDovetail launches the WDT Gallery & Workspace in the Hill St Shopping Centre; merging their online and offline programming in one centralised location open to the public, they are Middlesbrough's leading digital art site.

We have commissioned artist duo Barefoot Kitchen CIC to restore the garden post in preparation to invite our Community Friends back to their weekly socials.

From January to March 2021, artists Suzie Devey and Carol Newmarch facilitated conversations and observations with people working, living and wandering in Middlesbrough, capturing their thoughts and feelings on living through a pandemic. Key phrases from the conversations were turned into ceramic street signs, such as Nurture Nature which you can now see displayed in the MIMA garden.

This year's Shipping Container commission was imagined and produced by Teesside artist, Stephen Irving, and was influenced by the urban landscape of MIMA and Centre Square. The work was made in situ as part of the Summer Garden Party.

IN THE CASTLE **OF MY SKIN**

In the Castle of my Skin is a sensory exhibition made through play and improvisation. A large sculpture by Sonia Boyce, based on the shape of Fools' Gold, threads through the exhibition, interlacing with artworks by 10 contemporary artists and selected pieces from the Middlesbrough Collection.

To Tend To is a video work by Laura Wilson in MIMA's main atrium space. In 2020 Wilson developed a series of online conversations about health and wellbeing and MIMA's Kitchen and Garden. This short video gathers snippets from these discussions. MIMA works with artists and communities to develop projects with food, cooking and growing. Wilson will be the first MIMA Kitchen and Garden Artist in Residence from September 2021 to February 2022.



Shaped by the relationships between people, materials and processes, artist Nicola Ellis presents her stunning piece Leggy at this year's Weekender. Assembled with used racking from a local Middlesbrough supplier, this sculpture fully immerses itself into the spaces it inhabits both physically and symbolically.





The phrase 'build bridges' is a positive one with an open context; to physically build a bridge for connecting isolated communities, shorten journeys or to promote cooperation between hostile groups. Here, Theresa Poulton interprets this as referring to racial relations. Located under the A66 bridge, Build Bridges is a colourfully geometric painting/banner responding to the theme of infrastructure. It's simultaneous blend and separation of multi-coloured and mono-coloured palettes relate to construction and form whilst inciting urgency in the foreground.


A "penumbra" is that region around the focal point of the cast, where the shadow is only partial, or imperfect. These form when a portion of the light from the source gets blocked by the shadowing object, not all of it does. 'Penumbra' by Bethany Hunton is the most recent Tunnel Gallery Commission as part of the Celebrating Hidden Middlesbrough project. It explores the hidden narrative of the ornate, elliptical railway station roofdesigned by British architect William Peachey, that was once there before it's inevitable removal due to severe damage during a German air raid in 1942.







